The nickname "**Terri**" given by the family and "**Clown**" by her spouse. Terri received her early and secondary education in the Duval County Public Schools, graduating from William M. Raines High School, Class of 1971. She later continued her education at Florida Community College of Jacksonville, where she earned her certification as a Nursing Assistant.

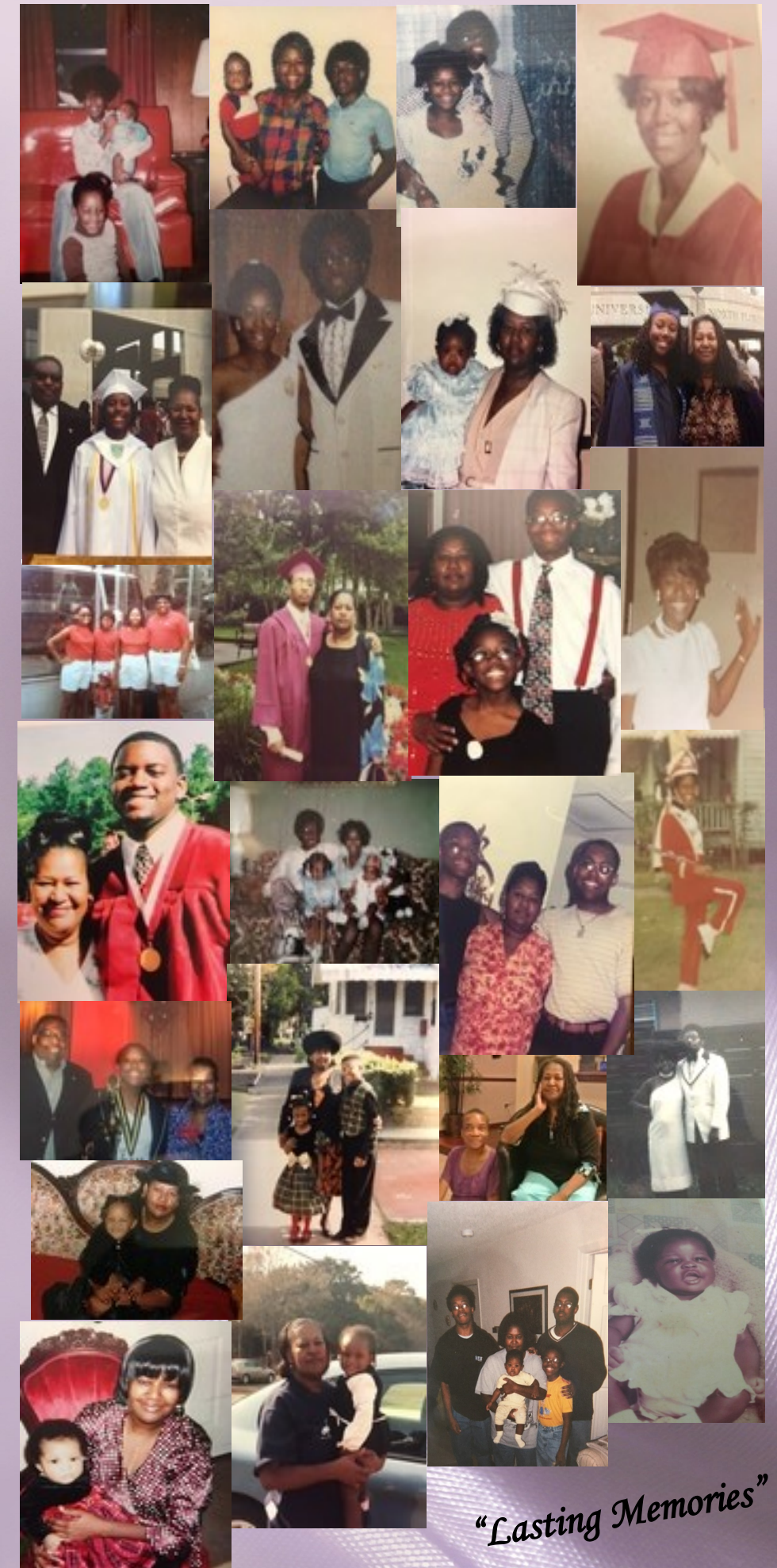
