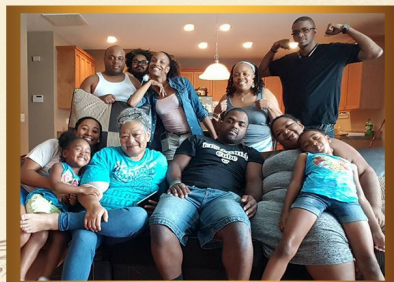
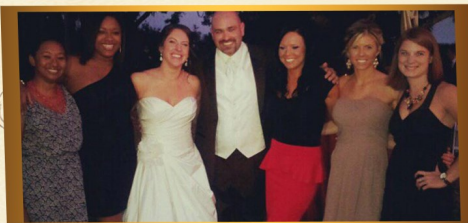

Yvette was born on Griffiss Air Force Base in Rome, NY. She was an Air Force brat and she has traveled the world from Misawa AFB to Westover AFB, MA to Eglin AFB, FL to Sumter, SC to Ft. Rucker, AL to Pensacola, FL and finally resided in Jacksonville, FL. She also traveled to Istanbul Turkey, Hamburg Germany, Brussels Belgium, Amsterdam Netherlands, London England and Las Vegas NV.

Her life took a turn on Jun 19, 2015, when she was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML). She began chemotherapy treatment and spent countless days in the hospital. And we all know how much Yvette hates hospitals....but the chemo worked on July 30, 2015, she was CANCER FREE!!! Shortly after that the cancer reappeared in her system. Yvette began a series of 3 Consolidation Chemotherapy Treatments in early winter at St. Vincent's, Riverside Hospital. She really enjoyed her friends and family coming to the hospital to sit and talk with her. She said it helped pass the time and was good to see a strong support system. Eventually, Yvette would travel to Gainesville, FL to Shands mid-summer 2016 to participate in a clinical trial for a Bone Marrow Transplant. She went through intensive chemotherapy, praying this would work. Unfortunately it did not work, on August 8, 2016; she still had Leukemia cells in her system. The doctors' said there really wasn't too much more they could do for her. She was surrounded by her family who loved her unconditionally on her final days before passing away on November 21, 2016.
