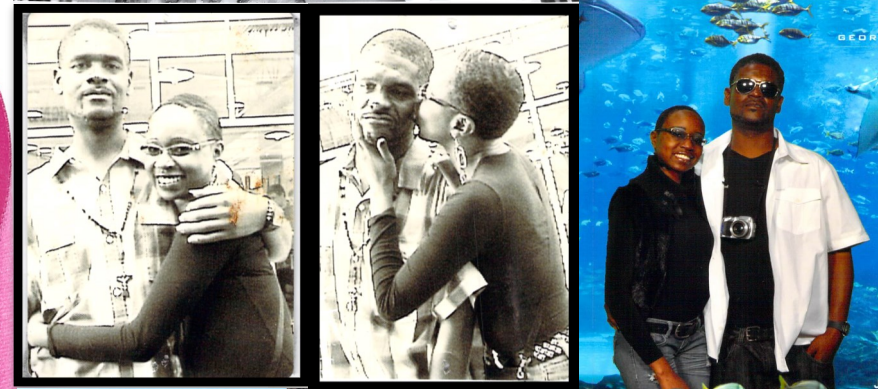
March 15, 1980 — July 22, 2017

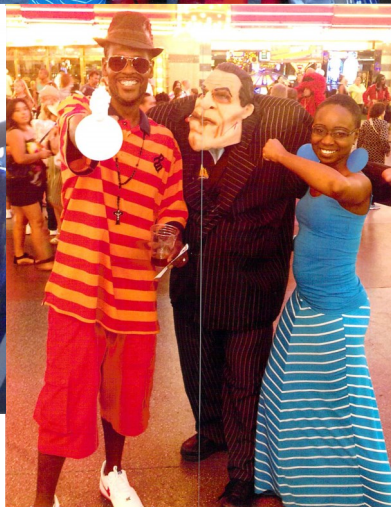

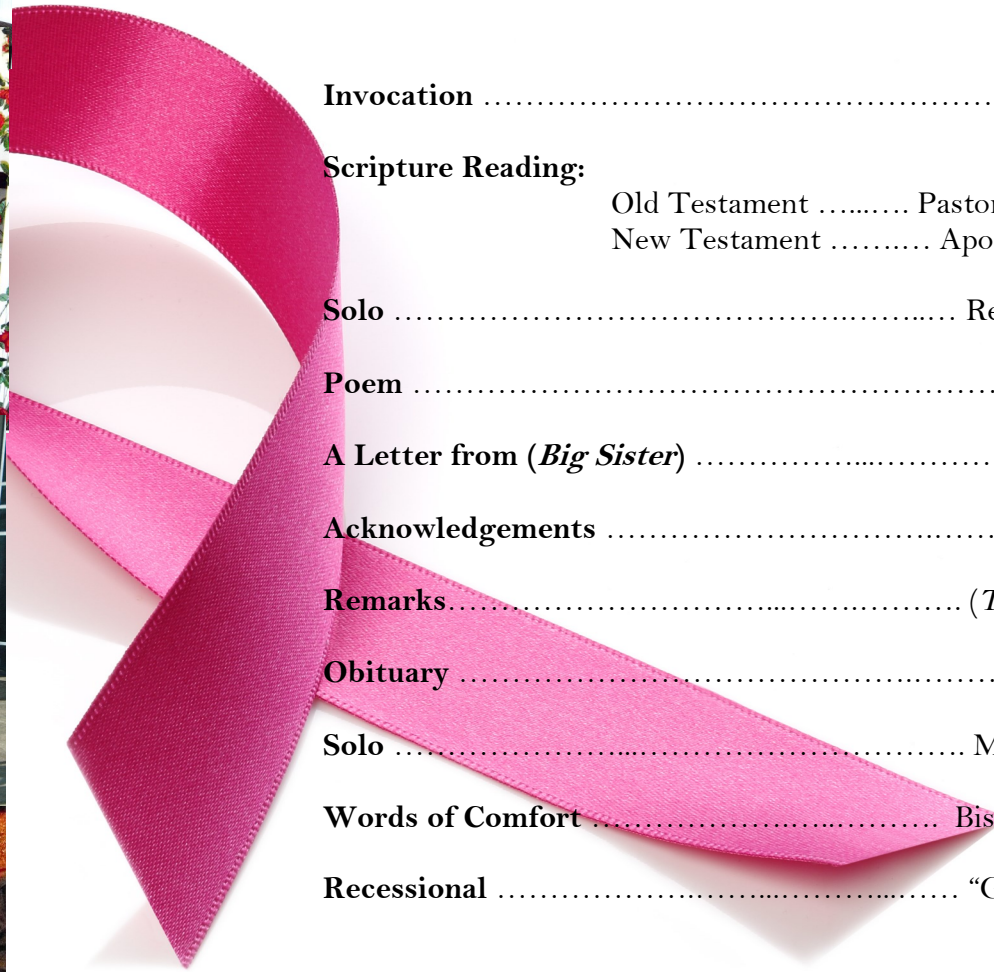
