


Mr. Kirkland departed this life on Thursday, September 7, 2017, 6:36 p.m., at St Vincent's Hospital, Jacksonville, FL the Lord called one of his angels. He was preceded into the heavenly gates by his parents, Bozzie and Corrine Kirkland; his loving brother, Marvin Kirkland; daughter, Mary Ann Kirkland; and his precious grandson Geraud Smith.

In the month of October, 1965, I began my employment with Ryder Truck Lines as a casual worker. At that time I was not old enough to become a regular or become bonded.

On my twenty first birthday, February 25, 1966, I begun my thirty day probationary period as a full time worker and was assigned to the loading dock as a checker until April 16, 1973. From that point I worked as a road driver until December 13, 1990 when Ryder went out of business. For the next three years I worked as a casual out of the Teamsters union hall.

On November 3, 1993, I began a thirty day probationary period with Yellow Freight and continued my employment with them until I retired on August 15, 2007.

I've worked a total of forty one years as a Teamster with thirty four of those years as a road driver. At the end of my driving career, I had logged in over three million (3,000,000) miles with only two accidents. Now I'm retired and ready to go fishing.
