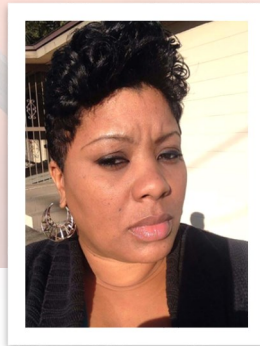
Celebrating The Life of Selena Letrese Harris Smith
