of Deacon Eunice Cleveland Bell

Deacon Eunice was born in Jacksonville, Florida on January 1, 1925 to Walter and Carrie Bell. He attended the local Duval County School Systems. In 1942, he gladly enlisted in the United States Navy. After his military service, he attended Walkers Business School majoring in business administration. Eunice worked for the United States Postal Service for 30 years. He was also the owner of E.C. Bell bus services.



Deacon Eunice accepted the clarion call of Jesus early in life and was a dedicated servant at the House of God Saints in Christ, where he became a deacon. He served under the leadership of Bishop Richard Givens. He later expanded his spiritual horizons at the Emanuel COGIC, under the leadership of Elder Gabriel Hall, where he was a faithful member until death. Eunice was known for his expression of thanksgiving through dancing and shouting "*Shouting John*".
