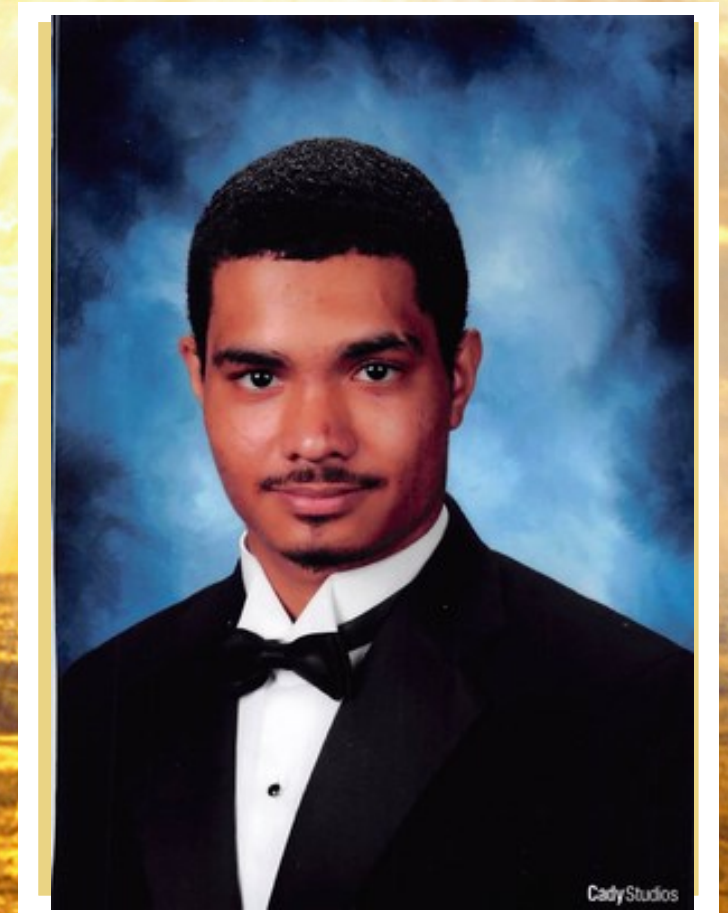

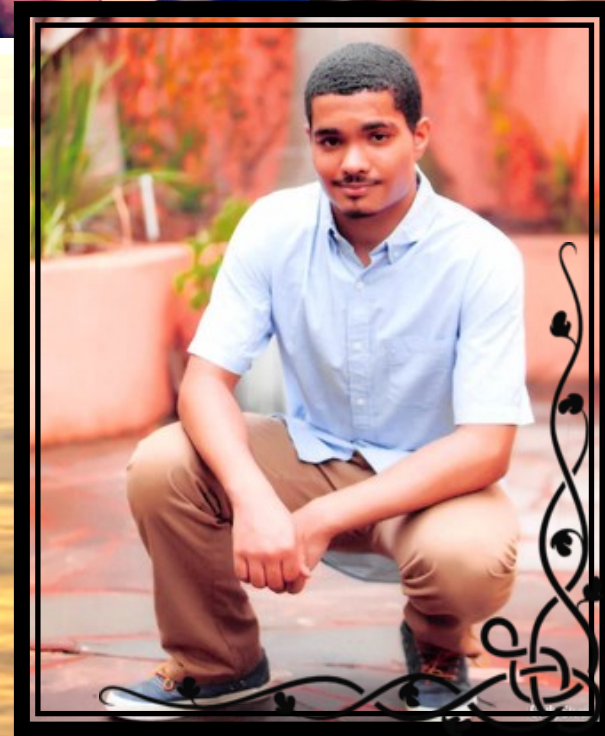
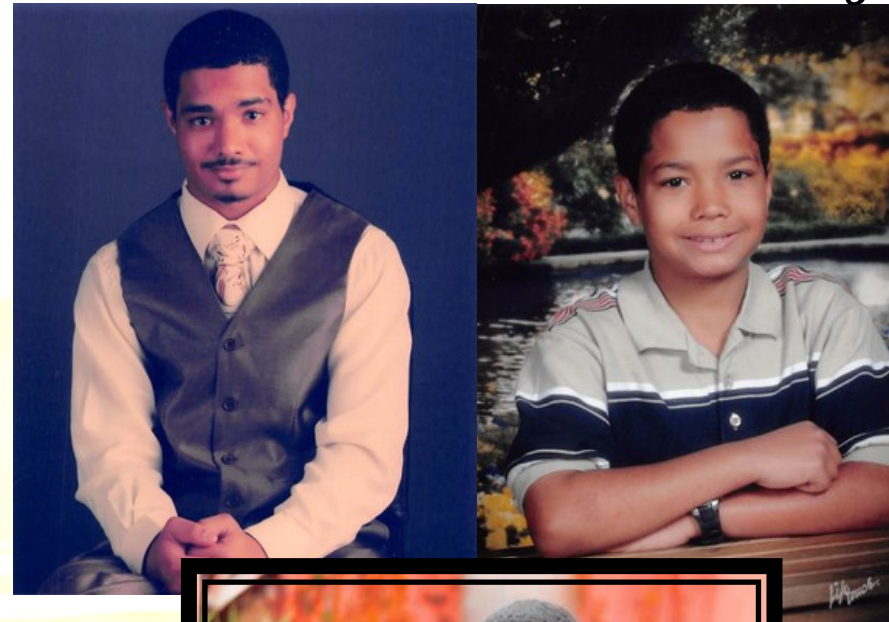
Obituary

Cody Alexander Williams was born on December 29, 1996 in Orange Park, FL. He became a welcomed addition to the Williams family in August of 2004. He was immediately enrolled in the Potter's House Christian Academy in the 2nd grade, where he received several awards and recognitions that included, Spelling B Champion, A/B Honor Roll recipient, Honor Society inductee, and School Valedictorian. It was also there Cody's gift of writing was discovered and nurtured. As a result, Cody became an official author when three of his writings were selected to be featured in a published collection of student writings that sold in major book stores throughout the country. This experience ignited Cody's interest in creative writing and motivated him to audition for admittance to Douglas Anderson School of the Arts Creative Writing Program. After a challenging first year at Douglas Anderson, Cody's writing ability progressed to a higher level of genius. This enabled him to compete in several writing competitions, both district and statewide. He served as School of Wisdom Superintendent and active participant in youth day services. Although quiet and reserved, Cody was also a prankster that enjoyed "punking" his parents. Very well versed, intelligent and articulate, Cody was always willing to share his personal views regarding politics and social issues.
