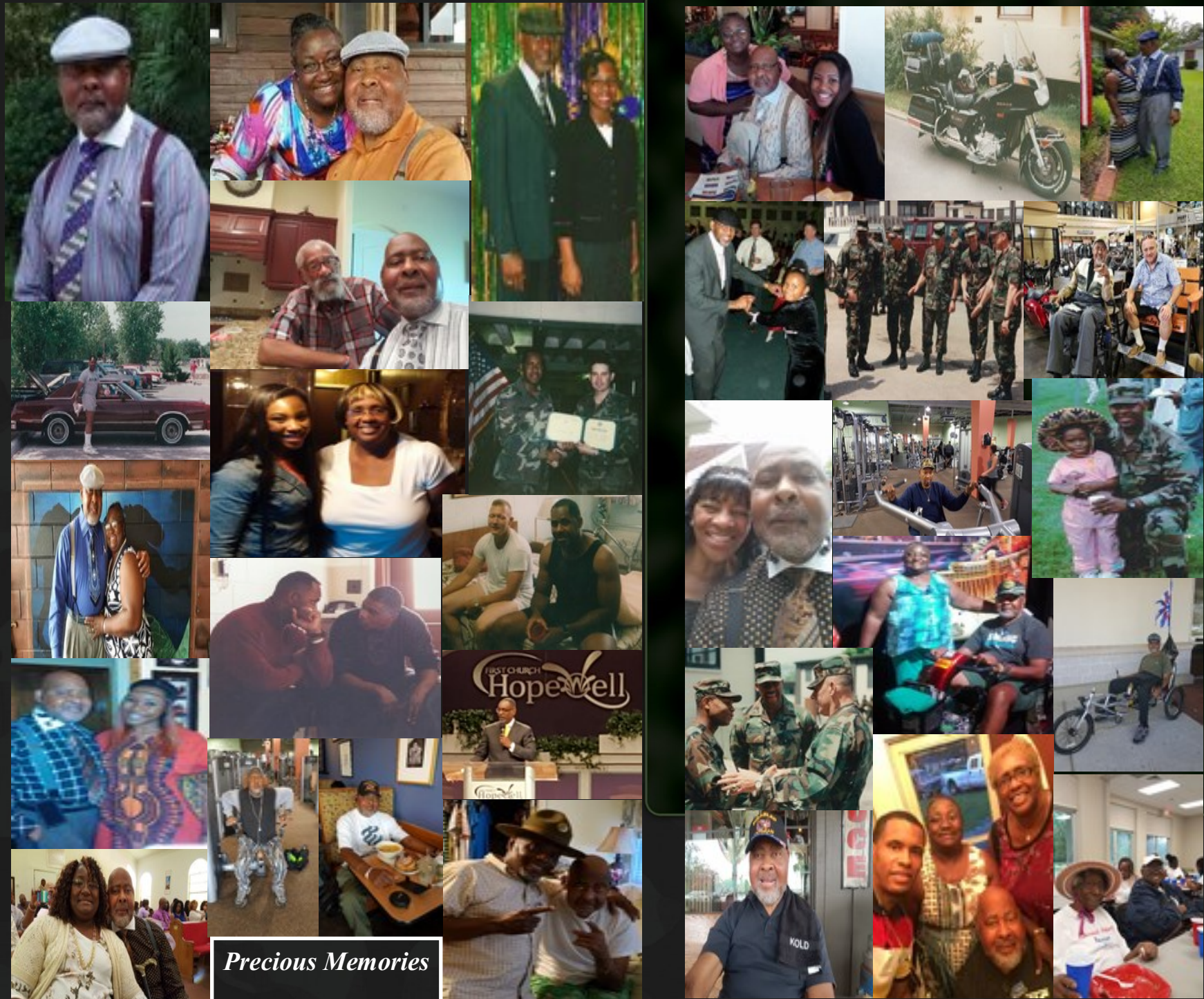
Command Sergeant Major Retired (CSM RET.) Dicty Lavant Missouri, 68, finished his race on Wednesday, November 27, 2019, after numerous health challenges. Dicty enlisted active duty in the United States Army in April 1971. He retired as a CSM (E9) after 30 years of meritorious service.
