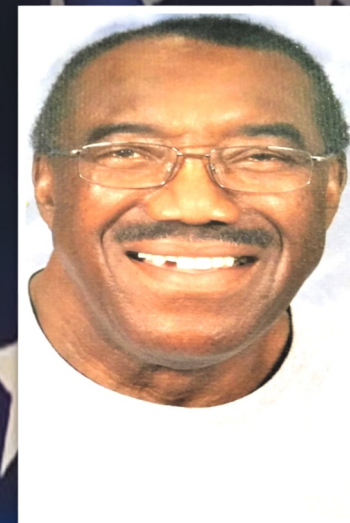

## Obituary

**Mr. Freddie Lee Davis, AKA "The Boss",** was born in Watertown, Florida on March 17, 1935 to the late Lee and Cora Lee Davis. He grew up in Lake City, Florida and attended Richardson High School where he was active in sports, a vocalist in the band, and he graduated as the class valedictorian.
