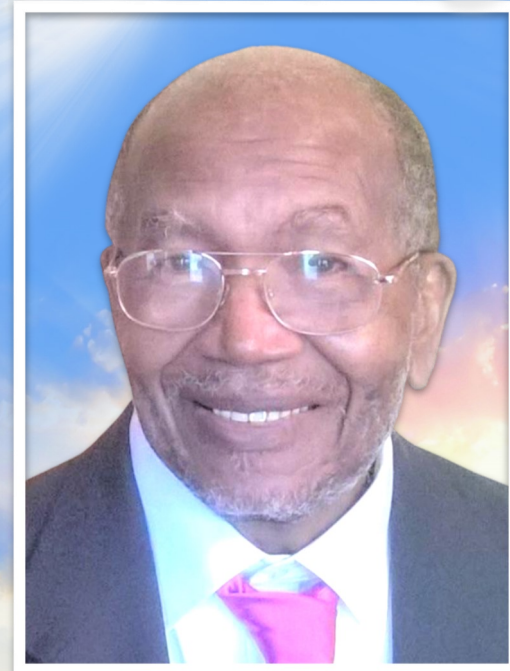

Obituary

Oscar McKeller, Jr., affectionately known as “*Big O*”, was born April 5, 1942 in Jacksonville, Florida to the late Oscar McKeller, Sr. and Hattie Hall McKeller and made his transition on Wednesday, March 10, 2021.

Oscar attended the Duval County Public Schools and graduated from Mathew W. Gilbert High School, Class of 1960. He joined the United States Army and fought in the Vietnam War from 1966 to 1970. He was a member of the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment and received multiple medals of honor including the Bronze Star. After his military service, Oscar was employed by the City of Jacksonville, Duval County Animal Care and Control Unit, where he retired after many years of service.
