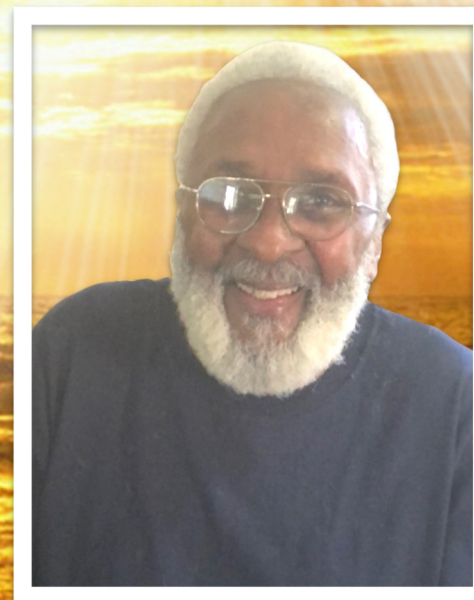

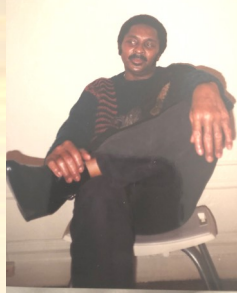
Obituary of Winston Antonio Whyte
