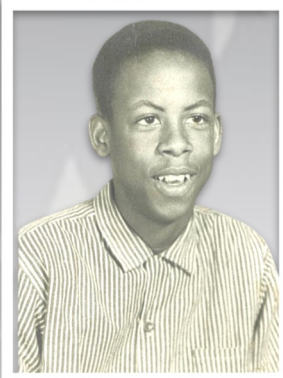

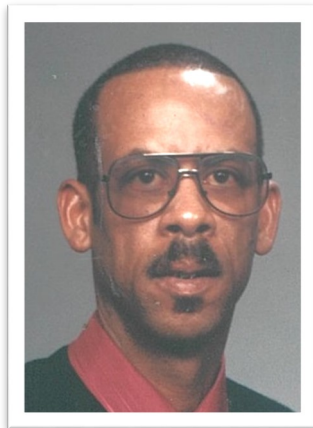
*Obituary
