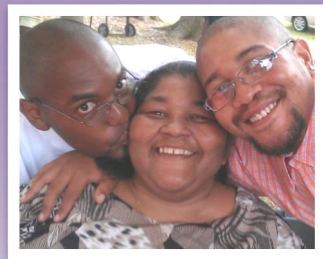
Betty Mary Lee Williams
