Obituary

Warren "Snooky" McKenzie, Sr. was born on August 14, 1934 in Jacksonville, Florida to Jimmie Lee McKenzie and Bertha McKenzie.

Warren was educated in the Jacksonville public school system. And enlisted into the United States Army after graduation.

Warren was a dedicated Veteran who served in the Korean War from January 27, 1953-December 18, 1954. He earned several medals for his service to our country, including the United Nations Service Medal, Korean Service Medal and the National Defense Service Medal. The discipline and patriotism that he learned in the Army never left him, as his family and friends can attest to. After serving in Korea, Warren was honorably released from active duty.

He returned to Jacksonville, Florida and started working for the Jacksonville Shipyards for a few years until landed a job at Laney and Duke warehouse, where he worked for 35 years.

In his free time, Warren had a passion for cooking and baseball. He was best known for his collard greens, which were always in demand at many celebrations in town.

Warren always kept his Christian faith close to his heart, which he accepted at an early age. One of his favorite scriptures is the 23rd Psalm.

He departed this life on Thursday, April 21, 2022 surrounded by his loved ones and was preceded in death by his brothers, Tommy Lee McKenzie, Roosevelt McKenzie, and Leroy McKenzie; and one sister, Delores McKenzie; and two sons, Tyrone Hayes and Willie J. Clark.
