Bishop Embra Allen James was born October 19, 1946 in Lake Alfred, FL to the late Willie and Cassie James. Bishop James was the youngest of five children (Samuel, Evelyn, Rose Lee, and Susie), and was affectionately known as "Baby Sonny".

On August 27, 1967, he joined the Church of God in Christ under the leadership of Elder Hall, during his Senior year in high school.

Bishop James received his diploma from Jewett Senior High School on June 3, 1964.
