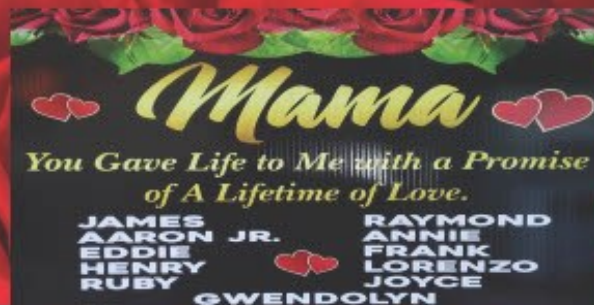

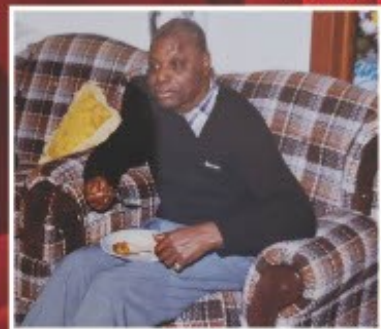
This union of marriage graced a total of 55 years until the passing of Aaron, emotionally known as "A" to her, in 1995.
