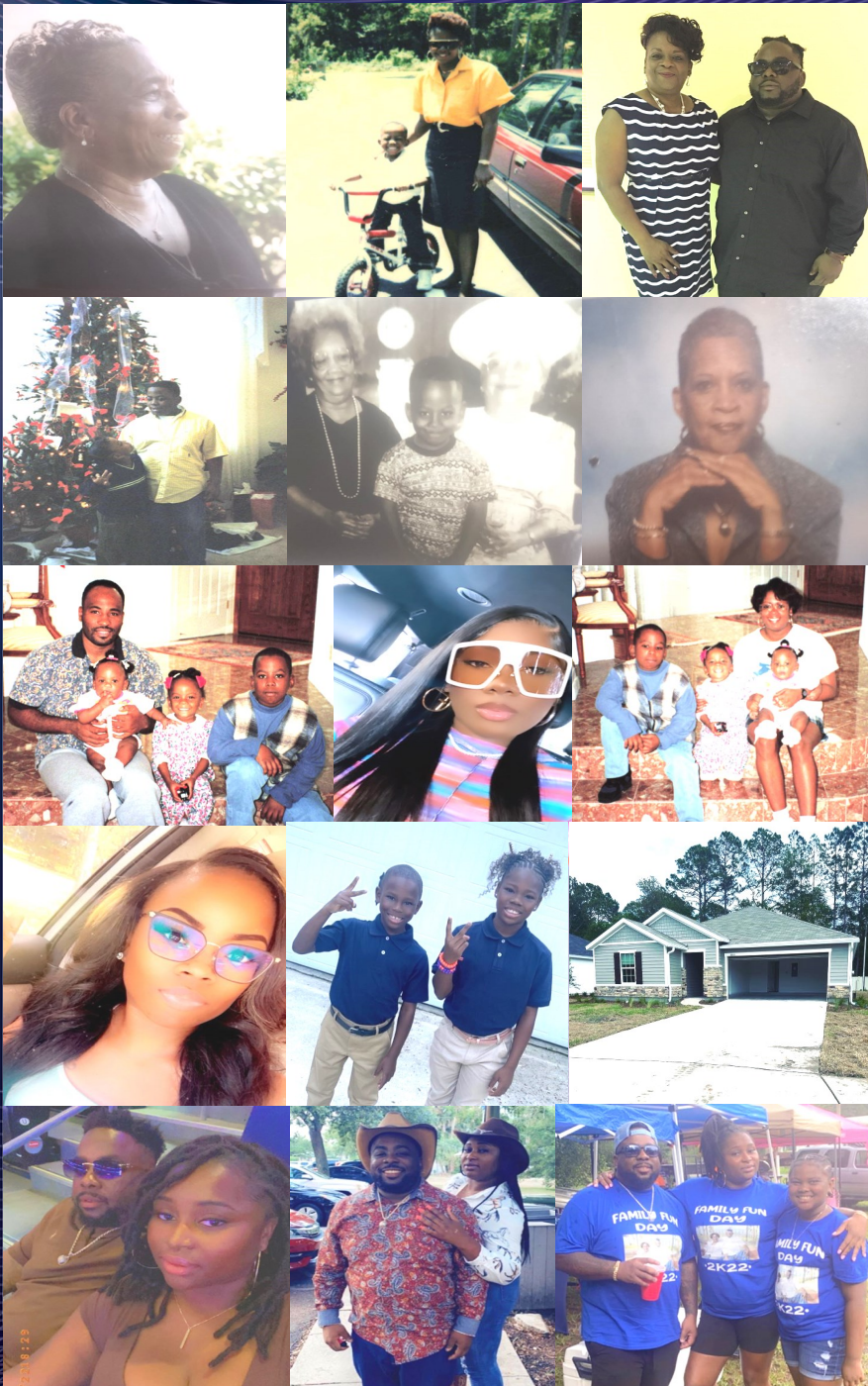

The Broken Chain

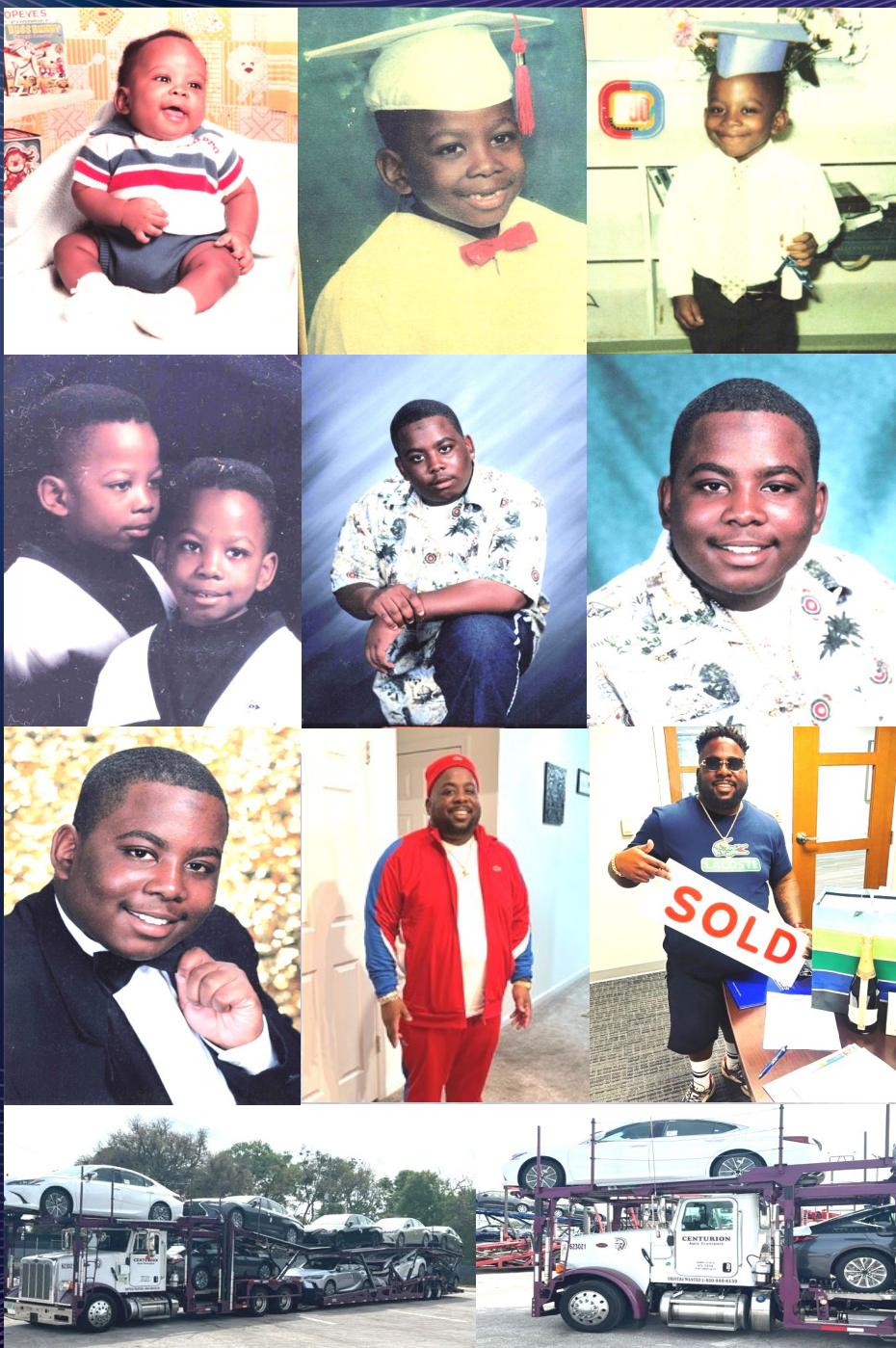
*We little knew that day,
